In 2000, the fourth generation of De Bever Architecten took over. Stefan de Bever (Eindhoven 1966), son of Leo, and Prosper de Bever (Eindhoven 1966), son of Loed, together formed the management of the studio until Prosper retired after a few years. Heleen van Heel, (Rotterdam 1965) has now joined as a partner. Both Stefan de Bever and Heleen van Heel studied architecture at Delft University of Technology. Both gained practical experience in Amsterdam and New York, at the offices of Herman Hertzberger, Ben van Berkel and Steven Holl, Benthem Crouwel respectively. After more than a century of presence in construction, every new assignment has been tackled with guts and creativity by the 4th generation of De Bever Architecten. They learn from every project, from every detail. New knowledge and insights are combined with professional knowledge and tradition. The current team designed offices, private homes and residential complexes, healthcare projects and Eindhoven Airport. Remarkable is the large number of repurposing and redevelopment projects such as the Choorstraat 's-Hertogenbosch monastery complex, monastery school Sint Martha and Don Boscokerk, both in Eindhoven. This is a typical phenomenon of a city that is secularized, where industry is slowly moving away and that slowly grows in size.
